What are you doing from 10 pm until midnight, Tuesday night June 3? I know it sounds crazy, but here's the invitation:

Think about joining your fellow PCS members (and interested non-members) at the synagogue for a late-night study of Jewish mystical texts (all in English) over cheesecake and other dairy desserts. I have to say that every year I'm surprised by how many people actually turn out for this! And yet there's something inherently compelling about being in a room with other adults in the still of the night; learning something new; and hearing the commentaries, interpretations, and voices of our friends and neighbors. So I hope you'll join us.

The occasion? It's the traditional late-night study which takes place every year before the holiday of Shavuot (but you don't have to be traditional, studious - or even Jewish - to participate and to enjoy). It's called a "tikkun" (which means "repair") and there is indeed something reparative about it. I guarantee – and I don't make this claim lightly – that you'll be happy you came. Given the alternatives – padding around the house, raiding the refrigerator, scrolling through your list of recorded programs – this one offers something really different.

We'll provide the coffee and a "starter" cheesecake, but feel free to bring your own cheesecake or other dairy dessert as well. (I've done the research, and while there are many stories which attempt to explain this, no one can say definitively why we eat cheesecake on Shavuot. Does it matter? It's delicious!)

Please note that our Shavuot services are Wednesday and Thursday mornings at 8:00 am. In deference to those with obligations those mornings we conclude both days by 10:00. And please note that the Thursday service includes Yizkor, the Memorial service.




